A Historic Year...

Our funding comes from:

- @ \$22M from the annual state operating budget. By law at least 75% must be used for grants
- 2% of state casino gaming revenues for the Gaming Mitigation Grant Program
- \$10M in partnership with MassDevelopment for state capital funding through the Cultural Facilities Fund.
- Nearly, \$1M from The National Endowment for the Arts

Because of one-time Pandemic Recovery funding, Mass Cultural Council is tasked with investing almost \$100M to the creative and cultural sector.

Arts & Culture and the Massachusetts Economy

According to the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, in 2020 the arts and culture sector contributed \$23.7 billion to the Massachusetts economy, representing 4.1% of the state's GDP, 125,091 jobs, and total compensation of \$13.6 billion.
