The MPO should revisit and update, as necessary, the Transportation Evaluation Criteria (TEC)
as part of their TIP development process

Complete Street (Freight) Recommendation:

The MPO is able to illustrate freight facilities, operation, and needs across region, but does not
have freight-focused projects on the TIP that would be eligible for NHFP. The MPO should
coordinate with MassDOT and freight stakeholders to program projects that would address the

region's identified freight needs

Civil Rights - Title VI, ADA, EJ, LEP Recommendation:

- Consider regularly updating a list of contacts from groups that they have identified in the Title
 VI Plan Annual Report to represent the interests of the EJ and LEP communities
- Explore methods to strengthen relationship with Community Based Organizations to serve as representatives from EJ populations
- Consider opportunities to include members in the Policy Board, JTC, and other task groups/subcommittee that are reflective of the demographics of the Region

Performance Based Planning and Programming Recommendations:

- The MPO should identify methods to ensure it is meeting its intent to update its regional transit

Summary

2020 US Census & Urbanized Areas Criteria

- Increase the minimum population threshold from 2,500 to 5,000
- Include additional housing unit (>= 2000) parameter to qualify as an Urban Area:
- Use housing unit density instead of population density to define initial Urban Area
 Cores
- Use only Census Block instead of Census Trace & Block to define initial Urban Area Cores
- Reduce the maximum jump distance from 2.5 miles to 1.5 miles
- Exclude the low density Hop or Jump corridors
- Cease distinguishing between urbanized areas and urban clusters
- Use Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) worker flow data to determine whether to merge or split between 2010 urban areas

Adjusted Urbanized Areas & Smoothing - MassDOT working collaboratively with MPOs to define, review, and confirm adjusted urbanized areas. Final versions to be reported to FHWA.


- Aligning with existing planning boundaries
- Incorporating local knowledge of urban landscape
- Addressing irregularities in boundary shapes
- Maintaining consistency with highway functional classifications

Adjustment Considerations

- Include entire municipality
- Include areas with urban characteristics
- Include large/significant traffic generators, e.g., airports, industrial areas, transportation terminals, transit routes
- Boundaries should be simple, without irregularities
- Boundaries should not split roadways or ramps
- Boundaries should be one contiguous area


Kingston:

FY 2024 Regional Transit Innovation Grant

Through the state budgeting process, MassDOT has available \$15 million in discretionary operating and capital funding to award to transit providers as Transit Innovation Grants. Awards will be made on a competitive basis with funding provided contractually. At least 25 percent of the funding (\$3,750,000) will be reserved for rural areas. Successful applicants will be required to report quarterly on their progress for the duration of the grant, as well as provide a one-page summary report of accomplishments at the end of the grant.

Any transit provider providing public transportation in Massachusetts is eligible. To receive an award, applicants must be registered with SAM.gov in active status. Organizations must be registered vendors of the Commonwealth.

Eligible Project Types

MassDOT is looking to fund projects that include, but are not limited to, the following categories and subcategories:

1. Enhancing and Expanding Transit Service

- a. New and innovative service delivery models pilot a new approach that may provide better or more cost-effective service for your riders and service area
- b. Expanded service hours or weekend service expand service temporally to better serve rider needs
- c. Rural connectivity provide transit in a rural area underserved by current options

- d. Connectivity improvements across regional transit authority service areas expand options for riders looking to travel from one transit authority service area to another
- e. Expanding mobility for low-income individuals and any other transit dependent populations

2. Transit Electrification

a. Small grants related to electrification of fleets, for expenses not covered by other funding streams

3. Other

Operating and capital expenses are eligible in each category.

Projects should not duplicate or compete with existing transit services already funded through MassDOT. Coordinating with and complementing existing services is encouraged.
