Summary

Rebecca Coletta, President, Old Colony Planning Council and Mary Waldron, Executive Director, Old Colony Planning Council to provide introductory remarks.

The Old Colony MPO is responsible for conducting the federally required metropolitan transportation planning process for the Old Colony region. The MPO board, comprised of eight voting members (including state agencies, regional entities, and municipalities) meets once per month to discuss a variety of regional transportation planning issues and direct the development of the MPO's certification documents (the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)).

Currently, the OCPC staff continues the Routes 3A and 53 Corridor Study in Kingston and Route 139 Corridor Study in Stoughton. These corridor studies will include an assessment of existing conditions (i.e. volumes, speeds, capacity, safety, levels of service, bicycle, and pedestrian conditions), and the development of short term and long-term recommendations as well as strategies to improve conditions, accessibility, and mobility. Such corridor studies include public participation and engagement, and serve as an important resource in project development.

Examples of recent studies completed by OCPC include:

- Route 18 Corridor Study in the communities of Bridgewater and East Bridgewater;
- Commuter Origins Report (documents community of origin for those vehicles parked during the survey day at MBTA Commuter Rail Stations, MassDOT Park & Ride Facilities, and the BAT Intermodal Centre);
- Old Colony Traffic Volumes Report (1993-2023); and
- Year End 2023 Measures of Effectiveness (MOE) Report (documents public outreach activities and seeks to analyze the measures the effectiveness of the outreach).

Examples of Regional Goals from the 2050 Old Colony Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) include:

Accessibility and Mobility - Develop a transportation system that ensures access and mobility for all motorized and vulnerable system users regardless of physical ability or prosperity levels. OCPC offers these priorities and recommendations:

- 1. Support BAT and GATRA with planning, support, and sustainable funding sources as they continue to provide life line service while continuing to innovate and respond to the evolving customer needs and ridership trends.
- 2. Address Old Colony Main Line Bottlenecks by implementing double tracking along Old Colony Main Line. Included in the FY 2025-2029 MBTA CIP is Rail Modernization Early Actions Old Colony Double Track (P1209) Track improvements to support hourly, all-day, bi-directional service on the Old Colony

Line and South Coast Rail. Includes design for double- tracking on portions of the Greenbush/Middleboro Lines and modifications of Middleboro Station's tracks. Commuter Rail Pre-Design \$10.0 M \$10.0 M.

- 3. Establish environmental justice commuter rail corridor.
- 4. Re-establish commuter rail service to Plymouth Station. Service began in September 1997, but was stopped in April 2021. The station would complement local and regional efforts to provide economic stability, support tourism, and foster growth and access to the entire area.
- 5. Minimize service disruptions and maintain levels of service on Old Colony Middleborough/ Lakeville Line once South Coast Rail Phase 1 commences revenue service.

Congestion - Develop a transportation system that minimizes financial and environmental costs associated with congestion and delay, and provide and maintain highway network travel time reliability. OCPC offers these priorities and recommendations:

1. Minimize recurring congestion at Route 3 and Route 24 Off-Ramps to intersecting arterials. Two examples include congestion and queuing onto Route 3 southbound up from the off-ramp at Exit 15B (Samoset Street) and Route 3 southbound up from the off-ramp at Exit 13 (Long Pond Road). Routine congestion and queuing may be due to the demand exceeding capacity of the current traffic signals to process the number of vehicles.

Safety - Develop a safe transportation system that minimizes the risk of serious injury to motorized and vulnerable users of the system and helps the Region and Commonwealth move towards its Vision Zero goals. OCPC offers these observations:

- 1. OCPC continues the effort to develop a **Regional Safety Action Plan** through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Program and has engaged the services of BETA Group, Inc. The Safe Streets for All Program is an initiative designed to improve roads and address traffic fatalities nationwide. The SS4A Regional Action Plan is on track with a completion date by June 30, 2025.
- 2. OCPC has a documented track record of conducting road safety audits to undertake formal safety performance examinations of roads and intersection utilizing an independent audit team. The audits qualitatively estimate and reports on potential road safety issues and identifies opportunities for improvements in safety for all road users. Road safety audits represent an additional tool within the suite of tools that currently make up a multidisciplinary safety management system aimed at improving safety.


















