9. Old Colony Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Regional Action Plan

Update and Status Report

Bill McNulty presented the Old Colony SS4A Regional Action Plan.

Old Colony Planning Council has contracted with BETA Group, Inc. to develop a Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Regional Comprehensive Safety Action (Vision Zero) Plan. This Vision Zero Action Plan will include all seventeen communities of the Old Colony region and allow for these municipalities to apply for Planning and Demonstration Grants and Implementation Grants in future funding SS4A funding cycles.

To date, the Consultant has developed a regional High Injury Network and is performing region-wide analysis to identify high priority safety locations throughout the region. Other work completed thus far has been the development of potential countermeasures, and the creation of a data dashboard.

The Old Colony Planning Council is working with BETA Group on the development of a Vision Zero Action Committee (VZAC), which will serve as the advisory committee guiding the development of the Plan. Virtual and in-person meetings with the VZAC will be held to present and receive feedback on the results of analysis of the High Injury Network and on plans for implementation.

In addition to the VZAC, public engagement will include individual consultation with municipalities, as well as regular updates to the Old Colony Joint Transportation Committee, Old Colony Metropolitan Planning Organization, and the Old Colony Planning Council.

Dan Salvucci mentioned the fact that there's been a lot of motorized scooters, bicycles, and skateboards going around town. He asked if there's been any issues like this in any other towns. Bill McNulty stated that he will pass this along to BETA Group.
