#### 0 = No

#### 1 = Being Considered

One or more groups within the community is currently advocating for a pertinent policy, practice, program, or investment regarding this topic, but no formal plan is in place

#### 2 = In Place

A policy, practice, program, or investment addressing the problem or opportunity has been newly adopted or adopted for a year or more without active implementation efforts and/or dedicated funding.

#### 3 = Being Implemented

A policy, practice, program, or investment is currently in force with substantial resources allocated to support continuing active steps to implement it effectively and, if in effect for more than a year, it is producing demonstrable results.
